

The Philadelphia Community Stakeholders (PCS):

- A network of African American community leaders, business leaders, and elected officials
- The PCS Education Recovery group is led by Sandra Dungee Glenn, former Chairperson of the School Reform Commission and current member of the Pennsylvania State Board of Education

The Issue: Our children are in a crisis

Educational crisis even before the pandemic

- Two-thirds of Phila. elementary and middle grade students were below grade level in reading
- In parts of our city, two-thirds students without internet access

COVID - 19 Slide. Pandemic has made problem bigger and deeper. Children lost hundreds of hours of learning time

- Learning loss for Black students may equal 10 months
- Enormous increase in the level of stress and anxiety that children, and families, are under due to the pandemic

Informed Community Engagement

Town Hall Meetings sponsored by PCS & State Senators

- Four (4) town hall meetings in August 2020
- Hear concerns and recommendations from community members
- Empower parents and caregivers to advocate for what is needed for their children to be successfully and safely educated
- Over 4300 households participated on the calls

Priorities Identified from Town Hall Meetings

- Services for special needs students
- Care for young children when parents return to work
- A place where parents can get information and resources for their children
- Social-emotional support for children and parents
- Access to WIFI
- Safe, clean schools

The PCS Model: A Community Response to the Crisis

- Adult supervision and support for virtual learning for grades K-12
- Supplemental lessons, activities to close learning gaps
- Effective and engaging use of technology
- Provide meals and snack
- Parent Help Desk & Referral Service
- Social and emotional counselingBy appointment
- ▶ Up to 30 students per site

Education Pods & Resource Centers (EPRC) Pilot

- ► The Philadelphia Community of Stakeholders is the sponsor.
- The Fund for the School District of Philadelphia, an established 501c3, will be the fiscal agent
- A corporate sponsor will provide the facility, maintenance and technology service
- The pilot will service all children attending public, Archdiocese and/or charter schools
