Share Food Program by the Numbers

Share Food Program serves more than 1 million family members and neighbors in need, in the Philadelphia five-county region, each month:

- Distributing 5 million pounds of emergency food relief, in our partnerships with 150 community- based organizations located in neighborhoods of higher poverty across the region
- Providing nutrition for 305,000 children in nearly 70 school districts through National School Lunch Program (NSLP)
- Delivering more than 3,500 meals to the doors of seniors and people with disabilities who are vulnerable to Covid-19
- Providing food to more than 6,500 seniors through Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP)
- Working with more than 1,000 volunteers who are still helping during Covid-19 to support food packing and home delivery
- Harvesting more than 500 pounds of food from our onsite Nice Roots Farm, and offering this food at extremely discounted cost at local farmers markets

What we're trying to accomplish

Based on the needs outlined in conversations with the county and the RFP:

- A dedicated food bank in Delaware County
- Equitable distribution of food among Delaware County Pantries
- Development of a job-readiness culinary program in the county
- Increased outreach to community members facing food insecurity
- ***More goals will be outlined in conversations with pantries and stakeholders

Share's Strategy in Delaware County

Focus on Equity

- Racial Equity
- Providing resources where they're most needed
- Using mapping and analysis in the decisionmaking process
- Open a warehouse in the communities that we serve

Dedicating the Required Resources

- Hiring a dedicated Delaware County Program Director
- Engaging a strategic planning consultant
- Obtaining a warehouse in Delaware County
- Onboarding other staff as needed, including a program manager for the job readiness kitchen program

Engaging Stakeholders in the Decision-Making Process Bringing all stakeholders to the table Initial surveying of pantries, stakeholders, and clients "No decision about us without us"

Communicating Consistently with Partners and Stakeholders

- The key to any successful team is communication
 Biweekly updates to pantries in Delaware County
- Regular calls with organizations fighting food insecurity in the county
- Ensuring a successful transition with Family & Community Services
- Regular visits to Delaware County Pantries
- Focus on community organizing

Opening a Delaware County Warehouse

By May 1st

• Acquire a 8,000 sq. ft.+ space

SIDN

- Centrally located for access to all of Delco
- Significant refrigeration and freezer capacity
- Minimum of 2 loading docks
